Public Comments on Items not on the Agenda

Madeleine: I am asking about paper blinds for pickleball play in the Gymnasium. Ping pong players would also like a sustainable way to block the morning sun.

Kathy: we have not budgeted for permanent blinds for this year. Our next opportunity would be next year. However, we may have extra funds after maintenance week. We have tinted the windows to help with the glare. Runners also like to see outside from the track.

Madeleine: For now, could we roll these temporary blinds up when not needed to reduce glare? Please consider new blinds for funding.

Michele: I agree this glare can make court play difficult.

Lisa: the Board can consider this during our next CIP cycle. We can contact you when we have determined next steps for action.

Staff Updates – Kathy Martin

Recreation & Senior Services

Long Range Plan Update - No consultants until September

Kathy: we are working on our citizen survey and with focus group members to inform Plan development. Our public open house is on October 29th during the day and evening. We will also have table at resource fairs, the farmers market, trailheads, and golf course. One challenge for us is that Comp Plan is not complete, so we do not want to get ahead of the Comp Plan's development process. Our Plan includes a trails master plan. We need two volunteers from the RAB to participate on the Trails Joint Advisory Board.

Michele and Dan agreed to volunteer, thank you!

Dan: I received a text from a polling company prompting input for the Plan's survey.

Kathy: this would not be from the City's consultant so it may be a scam.

Maintenance Week Projects

Projects include completion of another cell tower (AT&T) for the Rec Center, refinishing our hardwood floors, new/upgraded technology for fitness classes including Zoom access, pool upgrades, etc. Pool deck work should be finished soon.

Michele: for next year's maintenance, can Memory Square add more hours for lap and open swim while the Rec Center pool is closed for maintenance week?

Kathy: yes, we can consider adding more hours. For the batting cage, the electrical work is done but we have not yet completed all maintenance.

Dashboard

Kathy: The Dashboard captures Q2 expenses and revenue compared to previous year's Q2 (see handout). General revenues are up due to increase in auto debit charging by Rec Center users. Program revenue is also up due to increased demand for youth activities. Reimbursement revenue from County for meals is down in part because we can no longer count special event revenue.

Dick: can we see expenses as well next quarter?

Kathy: yes. Overall, we are doing well for revenues. Extra funds go into the Rec Fund. We can show the Rec Fund balance as well.

Michele: can you continue to increase nonresident fees?

Kathy: yes, we can consider this.

Golf Updates - Bo Lewis

Financials

We hosted a successful USGA event. Estimated 80 participants. Our season is ending soon, but we still have tournaments remaining. We will reverse the front and back nine holes as was done historically, with some minor adjustments. Signage is movable and Course will be re-rated.

Lisa: has a decision has been made to do this? The Board can offer our support in writing.

Motion: The RAB board supports the golf course's decision to switch the nines.

Second: Dick Friedson

All in Favor

Bo: yes, and we will let golfers know that these changes will happen in October.

Michele: there are rumors that a new clubhouse is a "done deal".

Bo: I have not heard this but will try to get the message out that this is not the case. Mark Jensen will be preparing an EOY financial report including revenue and rounds played.

Dick: please include expenses as well including equipment repair, etc.

Bo: I will pass this on to Mark to include.

Dick: in regard to Course neighbors, and news?

Bo: I am not aware of any feedback, but we can include this in a future report.
We are also proud of our Audubon certification.

Lisa: I drafted memo (hand out) supporting a fifth tennis Centennial court.

Dan: can we add language to this memo saying that this makes Centennial eligible for official league play?

Lisa: yes.

Kathy: we will have an update on rink conversion to pickleball courts next month.

Purpose:

The purpose of this agenda item is to provide RAB with proposed fee increase information for 2026 admission fees to the Recreation & Senior Center.

Background: Included is information on the past year's fees and prices from neighboring municipalities for comparison information. In 2025 resident fees were raised by 3% and non-resident fees by 7%.

Next Steps:

The PROST Department will make a 2026 fee recommendation to City Manager and City Council as part of the continuing budget process based on feedback received from the board. Staff is requesting the board make a formal recommendation on a proposed fee.

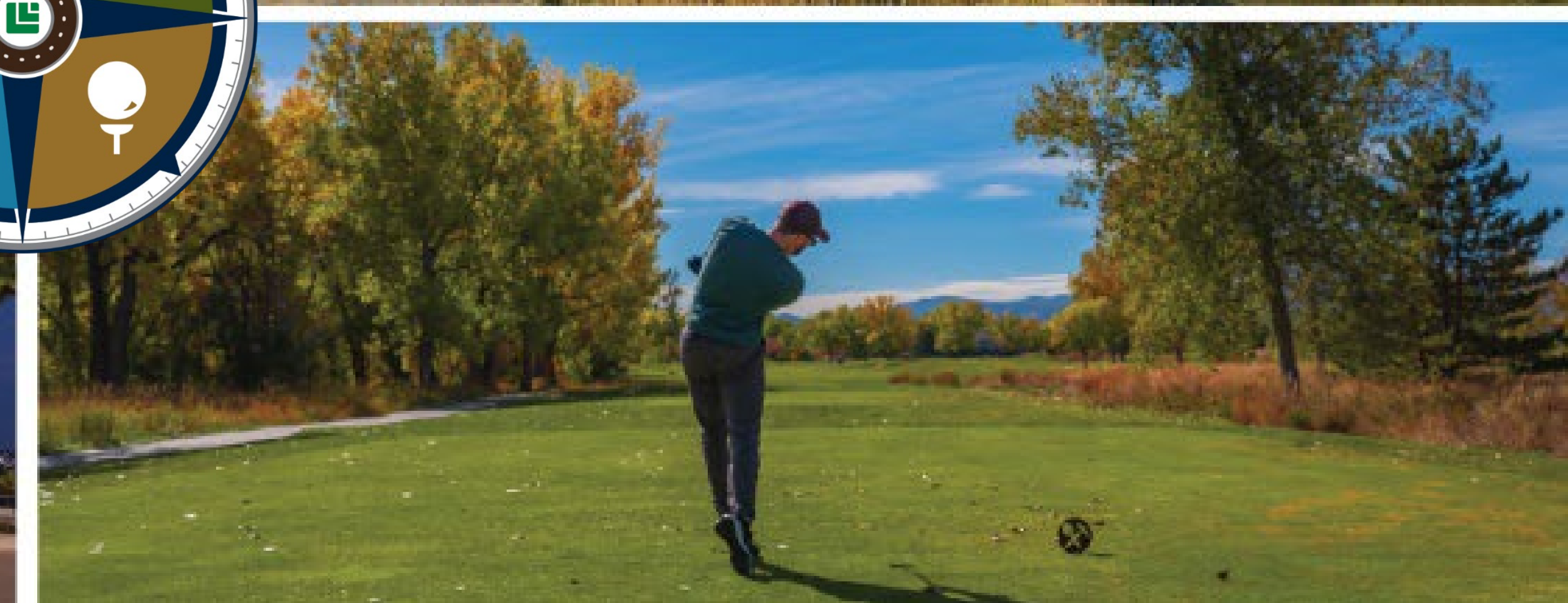

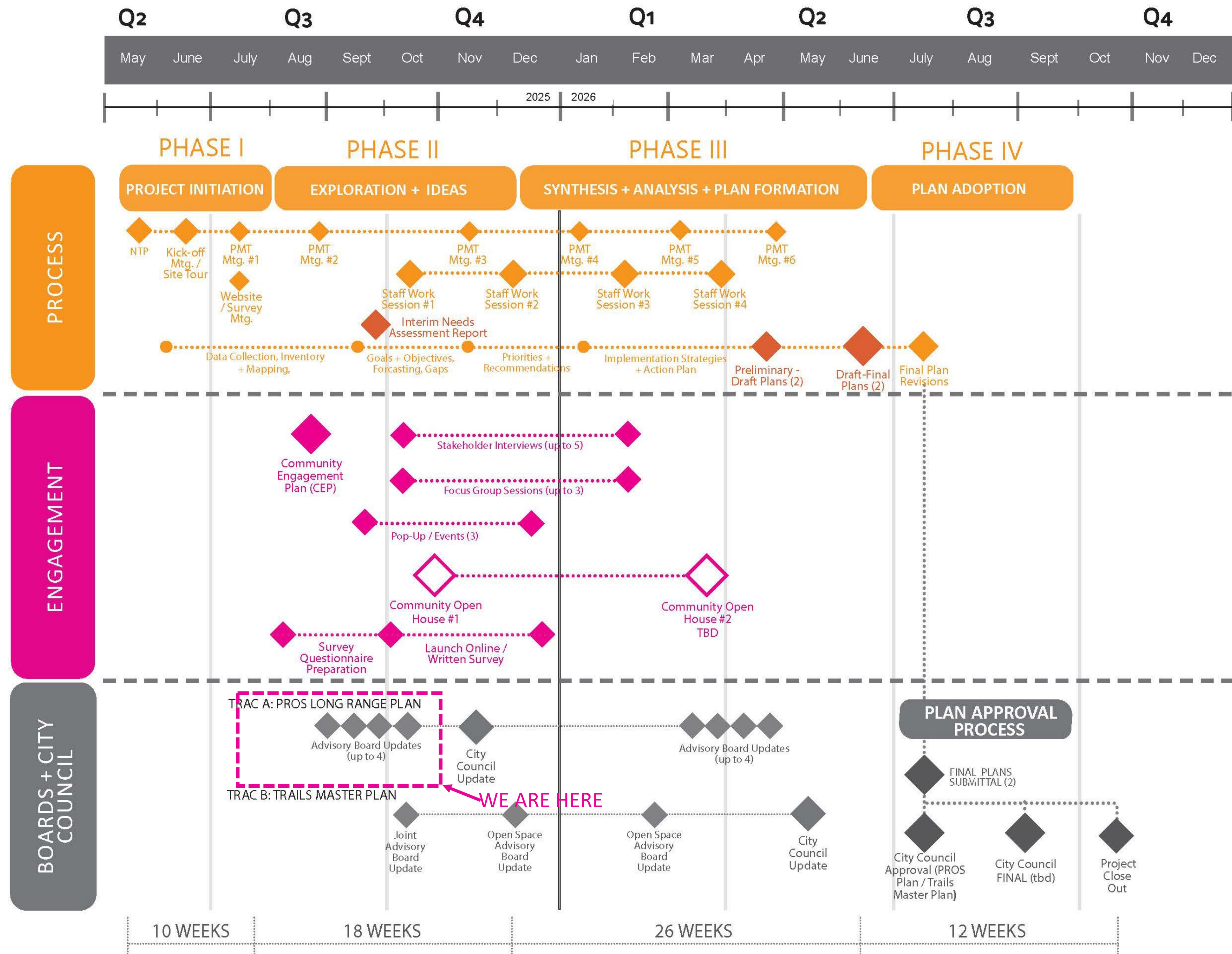

Re: Recommendation to add a fifth tennis court at Centennial Courts

Dear Mayor Leh & Council Members,

We are writing to respectfully recommend the construction of a fifth tennis court at the Centennial courts be considered. The Recreation Advisory Board strongly recommends the approval of this tennis court. As you know, demand for court time has consistently exceeded availability with the tennis leagues and public play. The current four courts at Centennial limit our ability to host sanctioned league play. Tennis leagues require a minimum of five courts, so by adding this extra court would allow Louisville to host tournaments and expand participation. A fifth court would also relieve scheduling pressure, improve access for casual play, and allow for expanded programming.

This project aligns with the City's goals of expanding recreational opportunities to meet community needs. By investing in this additional court, the City will ensure equitable access to a growing tennis population and extend the long-term value of the Centennial Courts facility.
