

**ORDINANCE NO. 1401
SERIES 2002**

**AN ORDINANCE ESTABLISHING A HISTORIC PRESERVATION
COMMISSION AS REQUIRED BY THE HOME RULE CHARTER, TO
SERVE AS AN ADVISORY COMMISSION TO THE CITY COUNCIL**

WHEREAS, the Home Rule Charter of the City of Louisville, Colorado, approved by the voters in an election held on Tuesday, November 6, 2001 requires that the City Council establish a Historic Preservation Commission; and

WHEREAS, the purpose of this Ordinance is to establish the Historic Preservation Commission, which Commission, pursuant to the Home Rule Charter, shall not be abolished; and

WHEREAS, members of said Historic Preservation Commission shall serve in an advisory capacity to the City Council; and

WHEREAS, said Commission shall make recommendations to the City Council that will enable the City of Louisville to be eligible for certification by the State Historical Preservation Office (SHPO) as a Colorado Certified Local Government (CLG); and

WHEREAS, the term, responsibilities, policies and other matters concerning the Historic Preservation Commission established by this Ordinance shall be as established by City Council resolution.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LOUISVILLE, COLORADO:

Section 1. Title 2 of the Louisville Municipal Code is amended by the addition of a new Chapter 2.66, to read as follows:

Chapter 2.66

HISTORIC PRESERVATION COMMISSION

Sec. 2.66.010	Created.
Sec. 2.66.020	Members.
Sec. 2.66.030	Powers and duties.

Sec. 2.66.010. Created.

There is created and established a Historic Preservation Commission for the City, which hereinafter in this chapter is referred to as the "Commission."

Sec. 2.66.020. Members.

The Commission shall consist of seven (7) members, each of whom shall be appointed by City Council. The qualifications, terms, and other matters respecting membership of the Commission shall be as set by City Council resolution.

Sec. 2.66.030. Powers and duties.

The members of the Commission shall serve in an advisory capacity to City Council, and shall have principal responsibility for matters of historical preservation. The powers, duties and responsibilities of the Commission shall be as set forth by City Council resolution.
